

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

The City of Hinton will be holding a Public Hearing to review an application for a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan and to make available to the public the contents of an environmental information document and the City's project plan. These documents include design and environmental information related to the proposed improvements to the City's water supply system.

The proposed project includes the construction of a new water treatment plant, its associated parking area, storm sewer collection & conveyance system through the water plant site. Also proposed is a new ground storage reservoir, new electrical power extension to the plant, installation of a new gravity sanitary sewer & associated manholes & apertures to connect to the existing system. As well as the construction of an access road to the WTP and all necessary excavation & engineered fill required to grade the site. A new Dakota Well #7 is also proposed, along with the necessary raw water main installation to the new WTP. The construction of a raw water main is proposed from the existing Well #6 to the new WTP and the installation of new finished water main from the WTP to the existing ground storage reservoir & distribution system. The installation of the water mains across County Road 60 are anticipated to be bored. The proposed project will abandon existing Well #4 and a 12-inch & 8-inch water main.

The purpose of this Public Hearing is to inform area residents of the community of this proposed action, discuss the actual cost and user fees associated with this project, and to address citizen's concerns, if any, with the plan.
